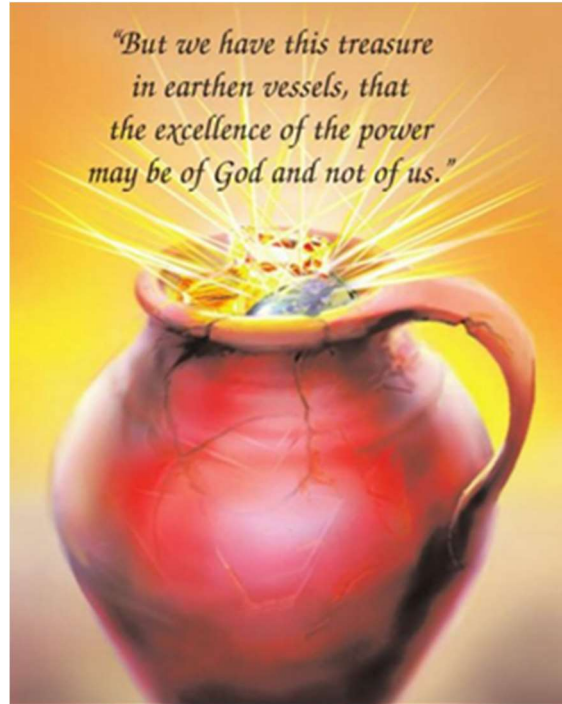

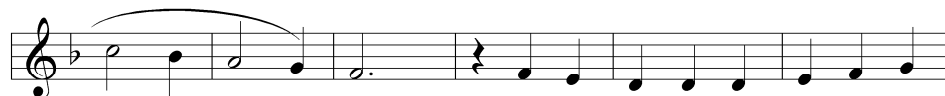

Second Lesson

2 Corinthians 4:4-7

⁴ The god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel that displays the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. ⁵ For what we preach is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. ⁶ For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," (cont. page 5)

Gospel

John 9:1-3, 6-7, 35-38

¹ As Jesus went along, he saw a man blind from birth. ² His disciples asked him, “Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?” ³ Neither this man nor his parents sinned,” said Jesus, “but this happened so that the works of God might be displayed in him... ⁶ After saying this, he spit on the ground, made some mud with the saliva, and put it on the man’s eyes. ⁷ “Go, wash in the Pool of Siloam”. So the man went and washed, and came home seeing. (cont. page 6)

Later on ³⁵ Jesus said to the man, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" ³⁶ "Who is he, sir?" The man asked. "Tell me so that I may believe in him." ³⁷ Jesus said, "You have now seen him; in fact, he is the one speaking with you." ³⁸ Then the man said, "Lord, I believe," and he worshiped him. (The Gospel of our Lord)
