

Easter Morning: He Is Risen!



L: (Luke 24:1-7) On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. ² They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, 3 but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. 4 While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. ⁵ In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? 6 He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: 7 'The Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, be crucified and on the third day be raised again." He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. He is risen!

C: He is risen indeed!

Confession and Absolution:

- **L:** People of God, even in our Easter Joy, let us remember why Jesus had to die in the first place—to pay for our sins. Therefore, let us confess our sins to God, asking him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness.
- C: Holy and merciful Lord, I confess that I am by nature sinful and have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this, I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me a sinner.
- **L:** God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. Amen.



First Lesson:


Select verses in Isaiah 25:1, 3-4, 6-9

- L: ¹ I will exalt you and praise your name, for in perfect faithfulness you have done marvelous things, things planned long ago...³Therefore strong peoples will honor you; cities of ruthless nations will revere you. ⁴ You have been a refuge for the poor, a refuge for the needy in his distress, a shelter from the storm and a shade from the heat...
- C: ⁶ On this mountain the LORD Almighty will prepare a feast of rich food for all peoples, a banquet of aged wine— the best of meats and the finest of wines.
- **L:** ⁷ On this mountain he will destroy the shroud that enfolds all peoples, the sheet that covers all nations; ⁸ he will swallow up death forever. The Sovereign LORD will wipe away the tears from all faces; he will remove the disgrace of his people from all the earth. The LORD has spoken. ⁹ In that day they will say,
- C: "Surely this is our God; we trusted in him, and he saved us. This is the LORD, we trusted in him; let us rejoice and be glad in his salvation."

L: This is the promise of our God.

weeping may remain for a night,* but rejoicing comes in the morning.



You turned my wailing into dancing,* that my heart may sing to you and not be silent.


Glory be to the Father and to the Son* and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning,* is now, and will be forever. Amen. ⁵¹ Listen, I tell you a mystery: We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed—⁵² in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed. ⁵³ For the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality. ⁵⁴ When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: "Death has been swallowed up in victory." ⁵⁵"Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" ⁵⁶ The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. ⁵⁷ But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁵⁸Therefore, my dear brothers, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain. (The Word of the Lord)



Gospel: Matthew 28:5–10

⁵The angel said, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. ⁶ He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. ⁷ Then tell his disciples: 'He has risen from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee. ⁸ So the women hurried away from the tomb, afraid yet filled with joy, and ran to tell his disciples. ⁹ Suddenly Jesus met them. "Greetings," he said. They came to him, clasped his feet and worshiped him. ¹⁰Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid. Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me." (The Gospel of the Lord)

- **L:** Lord of life, comfort all who stand at death's door and all who mourn the loss of a loved one who has died in faith in the risen Savior. Comfort us with the assurance that because Jesus lives, so shall we.
- C: Remind us all that the death of a Christian is not a defeat but rather a victory because of Jesus.
- **L:** Thanks be to you, O Lord, for giving us the victory through your Son, Jesus Christ who taught us to pray...
