The Lesson:

Isaiah 7:14; 9:6-7; 11:1-3

- **L:** 7:¹⁴ Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel.
- C: 9:6 For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.
- **L:** ⁷ Of the increase of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever.
- C: The zeal of the LORD Almighty will accomplish this.
- **L:** 11:¹ A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit. ² The Spirit of the LORD will rest on him— the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of power, the Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the LORD— ³ and he will delight in the fear of the LORD. This is the promise of our God.

The Gospel: Luke 1:26–38

L: ²⁶ In the sixth month (of Elizabeth's pregnancy), God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, ²⁷ to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸ The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you."

- C: ²⁹ Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be.
- L: ³⁰ But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, you have found favor with God. ³¹ You will be with child and give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, ³³and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever; his kingdom will never end."
- C: ³⁴ "How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?"
- **L:** ³⁵ The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God. ³⁶ Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be barren is in her sixth month. ³⁷ For nothing is impossible with God."
- C: ³⁸ "I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May it be to me as you have said." Then the angel left her.

The Gospel: Matthew 1:18–25


- **L:** ¹⁸ This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Because Joseph her husband was a righteous man and did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.
- C: ²⁰ But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said,
- **L:** "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." ²² All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet:
- C: ²³ "The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel"—which means, "God with us."
- **L:** ²⁴ When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. ²⁵ But he had no union with her until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus.



The Gospel: Luke 2:1–7

- **L:** In those days, Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. ² (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) ³And everyone went to his own town to register.
- C: ⁴ So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. ⁵ He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child.
- **L:** ⁶ While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, ⁷ and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.



The Gospel: Luke 2:8–14

L: ⁸ And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. ⁹ An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰ But the angel said to them,

- C: "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. ¹¹Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord. ¹² This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."
- L: ¹³ Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, ¹⁴ "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom his favor rests."



The Gospel: Luke 2:15–20

L: ¹⁵ When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another,

- C: "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."
- **L:** ¹⁶ So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger.
- C: ¹⁷ When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child,
- L: ¹⁸ and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them.
 - ¹⁹ But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart.
 - ²⁰ The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.



Jesus Is God's Greatest Gift

When the time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under law, ⁵ to redeem those under law, that we might receive the full rights of sons. ⁶ Because you are sons, God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, the Spirit who calls out, "Abba, Father." ⁷ So you are no longer a slave, but a son; and since you are a son, God has made you also an heir.



Responsive Prayer:

- **L:** Oh gracious and almighty Father, we praise you that you kept your ancient promises by sending your everlasting Son in human flesh.
- C: On this night made holy by your Word, receive our thanks and devotion, our songs and prayers.
- L: You sent Jesus as the Savior of the world to deliver us from the curse of sin, the power of death, and the torment of hell. Jesus took our place. He was born under the law to set us free. He was the innocent lamb of sacrifice. He came to die and to rise again in order that we might live eternally. Lord, firmly implant this good news in our hearts, and fill us with an eager desire to spread the Word concerning what we have heard tonight.
- C: May all who hear the message of Jesus, our Savior, be amazed and believe what is told them about the child.
- **L:** May the "joy that will be for all people" be our joy. May the "peace on earth" be our peace. May the birth of Jesus that Mary pondered in her heart be your joy now and forever. Amen.
