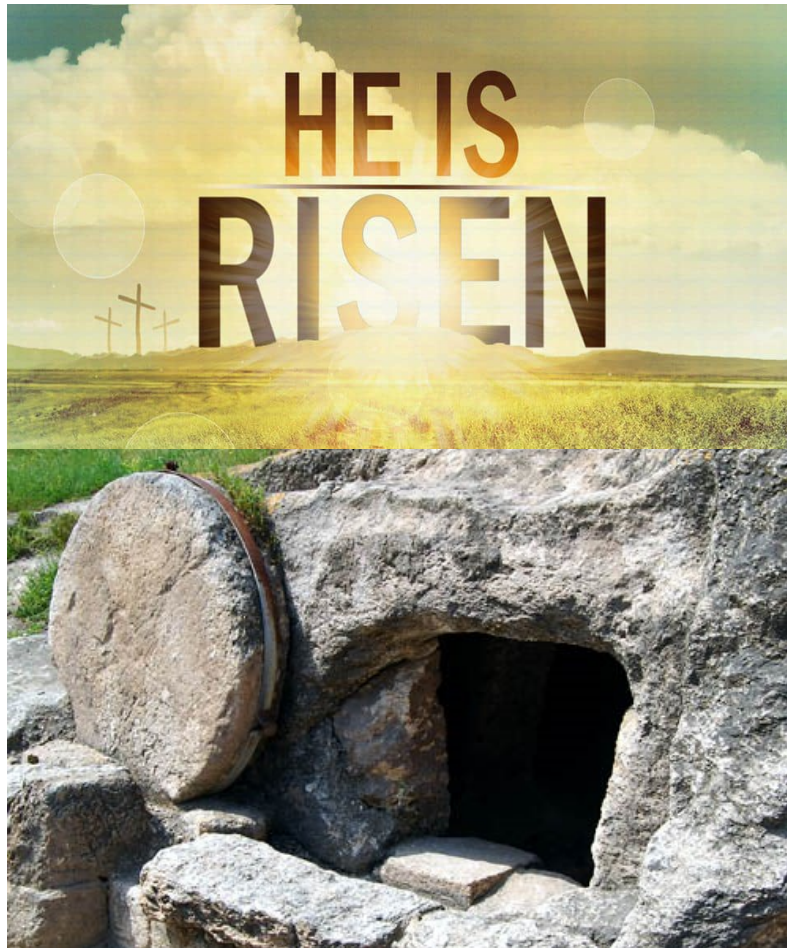

**L:** Let us sing and praise the LORD! Christ is risen,

**C:** He is risen indeed! Alleluia! Praise the LORD!

**L:** (Luke 24:1-7) <sup>1</sup> On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. <sup>2</sup> They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, <sup>3</sup> but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. <sup>4</sup> While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. <sup>5</sup> In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? <sup>6</sup> He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: <sup>7</sup>"The Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.'" He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. He is risen!

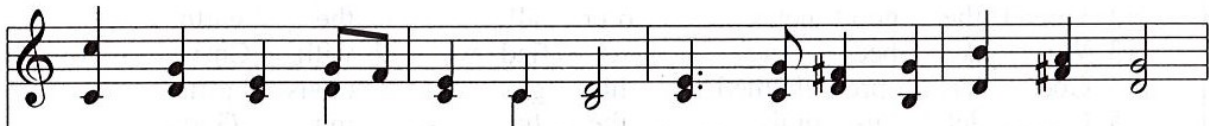

**L:** God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of God the Father, God the Son, and † God the Holy Spirit. Amen.

**Select verses in Isaiah 25:1, 3-4, 6-9**

**L:** <sup>1</sup> I will exalt you and praise your name, for in perfect faithfulness you have done marvelous things, things planned long ago... <sup>3</sup>Therefore strong peoples will honor you; cities of ruthless nations will revere you. <sup>4</sup> You have been a refuge for the poor, a refuge for the needy in his distress, a shelter from the storm and a shade from the heat...

**C:** <sup>6</sup> **On this mountain the LORD Almighty will prepare a feast of rich food for all peoples, a banquet of aged wine—the best of meats and the finest of wines.**

**L:** <sup>7</sup> On this mountain he will destroy the shroud that enfolds all peoples, the sheet that covers all nations; <sup>8</sup> he will swallow up death forever. The Sovereign LORD will wipe away the tears from all faces; he will remove the disgrace of his people from all the earth. The LORD has spoken. <sup>9</sup>In that day they will say,

**C:** **“Surely this is our God; we trusted in him, and he saved us. This is the LORD, we trusted in him; let us rejoice and be glad in his salvation.”**

**L:** This is the promise of our God.

**Second Lesson:**

**1 Corinthians 15:51-58**

**L:** <sup>51</sup> Listen, I tell you a mystery:

We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed— <sup>52</sup> in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed. <sup>53</sup> For the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality.

<sup>54</sup> When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: “Death has been swallowed up in victory.”


**C:** <sup>55</sup>“Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?”

**L:** <sup>56</sup> The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. <sup>57</sup> But thanks be to God!


**C:** He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

**L:** <sup>58</sup> Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain. (The Word of the Lord)

**Gospel:**

**Matthew 28:2–10 & John 20:2 –10**

**L:** <sup>2</sup> There was a violent earthquake, for an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and, going to the tomb, rolled back the stone and sat on it.

**C:** <sup>3</sup> **His appearance was like lightning, and his clothes were white as snow.**  
<sup>4</sup> **The guards were so afraid of him that they shook and became like dead men.**

**L:** <sup>28:5</sup> The angel said, “Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. <sup>6</sup> He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. <sup>7</sup> Then tell his disciples: ‘He has risen from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee.

<sup>8</sup> So the women hurried away from the tomb, afraid yet filled with joy, and ran to tell his disciples. <sup>9</sup> Suddenly Jesus met them. “Greetings,” he said. They came to him, clasped his feet and worshiped him. <sup>10</sup> Then Jesus said to them, “Do not be afraid. Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me.” <sup>20:2</sup> So they came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, and said,

**C:** **“They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don’t know where they have put him!”**

**L:** <sup>3</sup> So Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. <sup>4</sup> Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. <sup>5</sup> He bent over and looked in at the strips of linen lying there but did not go in. <sup>6</sup> Then Simon Peter came along behind him and went straight into the tomb. He saw the strips of linen lying there, <sup>7</sup> as well as the cloth that had been wrapped around Jesus’ head. The cloth was still lying in its place, separate from the linen. <sup>8</sup> Finally the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed. <sup>9</sup> (They still did not understand from Scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead.) <sup>10</sup> Then the disciples went back to where they were staying. (The Gospel of the Lord)

**C: He is risen indeed! Preserve us in faith, raise us to newness of life, and continue to lavish on us the blessing of the day of victory.**

**L:** Lord of life, comfort all who stand at death’s door and all who mourn the loss of a loved one who has died in faith in the risen Savior. Comfort us with the assurance that because Jesus lives, so shall we.

**C: Remind us all that the death of a Christian is not a defeat but rather a victory because of Jesus.**

**L:** Thanks be to you, O Lord, for giving us the victory through your Son, Jesus Christ who taught us to pray...

**Lord’s Prayer:** *(traditional)*

***Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name,  
thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven,  
Give us this day our daily bread;  
and forgive us our trespasses,  
as we forgive those who trespass against us;

Amen!***

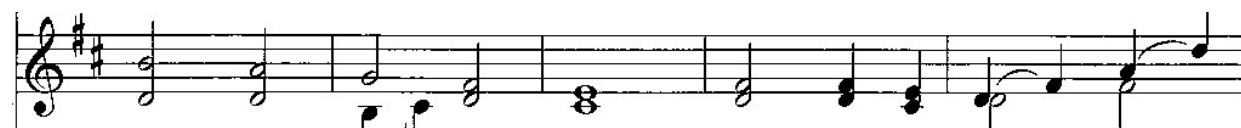
