First Lesson: Isaiah 66:1–6 (NIV 84)


^{66:1} This is what the LORD says: "Heaven is my throne, and the earth is my footstool. Where is the house you will build for me? Where will my resting place be? ² Has not my hand made all these things, and so they came into being?" declares the LORD.

"This is the one I esteem: he who is humble and contrite in spirit, and trembles at my word. ³ But whoever sacrifices a bull is like one who kills a man, and whoever offers a lamb, like one who breaks a dog's neck; whoever makes a grain offering is like one who presents pig's blood, and whoever burns memorial incense, like one who worships an idol. They have chosen their own ways, and their souls delight in their abominations; ⁴ so I also will choose harsh treatment for them and will bring upon them what they dread. For when I called, no one answered, when I spoke, no one listened. They did evil in my sight and chose what displeases me." ⁵ Hear the word of the LORD, you who tremble at his word:

"Your brothers who hate you, and exclude you because of my name, have said, 'Let the LORD be glorified, that we may see your joy!' Yet they will be put to shame. ⁶ Hear that uproar from the city, hear that noise from the temple! It is the sound of the LORD repaying his enemies all they deserve. This is the Word of our God.

Second Lesson:

Galatians 6:1–10 (NIV 84)

(Paul writes) ^{6:1} Brothers *and sisters*, if someone is caught in a sin, you who are spiritual should restore him gently. But watch yourself, or you also may be tempted. ² Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. ³ If anyone thinks he is something when he is nothing, he deceives himself. ⁴ Each one should test his own actions. Then he can take pride in himself, without comparing himself to somebody else, ⁵ for each one should carry his own load. ⁶ Anyone who receives instruction in the word must share all good things with his instructor. ⁷ Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. ⁸ The one who sows to please his sinful nature, from that nature will reap destruction; the one who sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life. ⁹ Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. ¹⁰ Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers. Luke 10:1-12 (NIV 84)

- ^{10:1} The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them two by two ahead of him to every town and place where he was about to go.
- ² He told them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.
- ³ Go! I am sending you out like lambs among wolves.
- ⁴ Do not take a purse or bag or sandals; and do not greet anyone on the road.
- ⁵ "When you enter a house, first say, 'Peace to this house.'
- ⁶ If a man of peace is there, your peace will rest on him; if not, it will return to you.
- ⁷ Stay in that house, eating and drinking whatever they give you, for the worker deserves his wages. Do not move around from house to house.
- ⁸ "When you enter a town and are welcomed, eat what is set before you.
- ⁹ Heal the sick who are there and tell them, 'The kingdom of God is near you.'
- ¹⁰ But when you enter a town and are not welcomed, go into its streets and say, ¹¹ 'Even the dust of your town that sticks to our feet we wipe off against you. Yet be sure of this: The kingdom of God is near.'
- ¹² I tell you, it will be more bearable on that day for Sodom than for that town.
